

D Minor Harmonic Scale

There is 1 flat in this scale which means that 1 note is lowered as indicated above.

Notice that the seventh note is raised in the harmonic minor scale.

Make sure that you follow the fingering as written above each note. Remember, your thumbs are "1" and you number out from there to your pinky fingers which are "5".

The right hand starts on the D next to Middle C and goes up one octave. The left hand starts an octave below the right.

Start with the right hand first. Once you feel comfortable with that, move to the left hand. After that play the scale with both hands.

Once you have mastered playing just one octave, move on to playing 2 octaves. Pay attention to your fingering as you move into the second octave.

Practicing your scales is a great way to improve your dexterity and understand the relationship of all of the notes found in a key, in this case the key of D Minor.
